Old Testament Reading.....Leviticus 19:1-4, 11-13a, 16-18

God requires absolute holiness and perfection—a standard we cannot measure up to. But "we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all" (Hebrews 10:10).

The LORD said to Moses, "Speak to the entire assembly of Israel and say to them: 'Be holy because I, the LORD your God, am holy.

"Each of you must respect his mother and father, and you must observe My Sabbaths. I am the LORD your God.

"Do not turn to idols or make gods of cast metal for yourselves. I am the LORD your God. . .

- "Do not steal.
- "Do not lie.
- "Do not deceive one another.
- "Do not swear falsely by My name and so profane the name of your God. I am the LORD.

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Epistle ReadingColossians 3:1-17

Since through Baptism we have spiritually died and risen with Christ, we set our hearts and minds not on earthly things but on things above. The Christian life is one of love and forgiveness, which can only be inspired and empowered by being in God's Word.

Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory.

Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. Because of these, the wrath of God is coming. You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. But now you must rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. Here there is no Greek or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all.

Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues put on love, which binds you all together in perfect unity.

Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful. Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.



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Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times?"

Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy times seven.

"Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand talents was brought to him. Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt.

"The servant fell on his knees before him. 'Be patient with me,' he begged, 'and I will pay back everything.' The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go.

"But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii. He grabbed him and began to choke him. 'Pay back what you owe me!' he demanded.

"His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.'

"But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. When the other servants saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed and went and told their master everything that had happened.

"Then the master called the servant in. 'You wicked servant,' he said, 'I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?' In anger his master turned him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.

"This is how My heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother from your heart."

TODAY'S WORSHIP — Forgiving as the Lord Forgives Us. In settling His accounts with us, our Lord acts not with anger, but with compassion. He does not imprison us as we deserve, but He forgives all our debts and releases us (Matthew 18:23-27). Therefore, our Lord bids each of us to have "mercy on your fellow servant" and "forgive your brother from your heart" (Matthew 18:33, 35). By the Lord's forgiveness of our sins, we are free to forgive those who sin against us, because He has been handed over to the jailers in our stead, and He has paid our entire debt with His lifeblood. By God's grace in Jesus Christ we are holy just as He is holy (Leviticus 19:2). This gift of holiness begins with fearing, loving, and trusting God above all things and leads us to love our neighbor as ourselves (Leviticus 19:18). No longer will we "take vengeance or bear a grudge" (Leviticus 19:15-18). For, though we were His enemies, our Lord Jesus Christ has loved us and forgiven In response, we will "Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you" (Colossians 3:13).

PRAYER BEFORE WORSHIP — Almighty and everlasting Father, You give Your children many blessings even though we are undeserving. In every trial and temptation grant us steadfast confidence in Your loving-kindness and mercy; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. BUILDING UPDATE — Our building project has been delayed because the engineering survey revealed our existing septic tank is directly under the footprint of the proposed addition. Because of the complexity and potential high cost of a new septic system, and uncertainty about what type

of system the county would require, we have been working on an alternate plan that would keep the same features but place the addition and new drive-thru entry on the north side of the building. This addition would mirror the wing currently extending from the south side of the building and create a T-shaped structure. In addition to saving a great deal of effort and expense replacing our septic system, it also seems this alternate plan could have other benefits over the original proposal. We are currently finalizing plans with Legacy Builders of Paola, who have recently completed several church additions in our area. At this time we have only preliminary sketches, but when the new plan is completed it will be shared with the congregation. If you have questions please contact chairman Greg Windler.
